Discharged Marine Awarded Hero's Medal

Corporal Robert A. Paul recently received the Navy and Marine Corps medal for heroism while serving in the Republic of Vietnam.

The medal was presented by Lt. Col. Herbert V. Lundin, his commanding officer.

While serving in Chu Lai, Vietnam in July 1965, a fuel line ruptured during the refueling of an A4C jet aircraft, starting a large fire.

Completely disregarding the fact his clothing was on fire, Cpl. Paul pulled the hose into the open to prevent feeding more fuel into the area.



When clear, he extinguished the fire consuming his clothing and immediately

6-Man Jury Says Parents Are Guilty

Sentencing of a Livonia couple who neglected their five-year-old daughter awaits the report of the Livonia Probation Officer.

A six-man jury, Friday, Oct. 28, declared William J. Worley, 28 and his wife, Ruth, 27, guilty of contributing to neglect of a minor child.

Police said that the Worley's daughter, Kathy Diane, was left alone Jan. 10 of this year at the Worley home, 12484 Cardwell.

When she tried to cook something for herself, near four o'clock in the afternoon, her clothing caught fire and she suffered second and third degree burns over 25 percent of her body.

The Worleys also have a son, 7, who was not at home at the time.

Officers reported that the Worleys frequently left the children alone between 3 and 6 p.m.

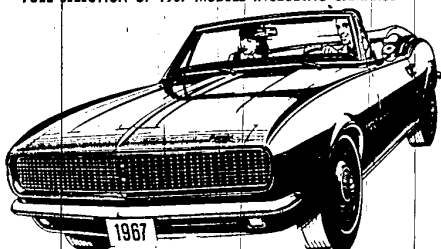

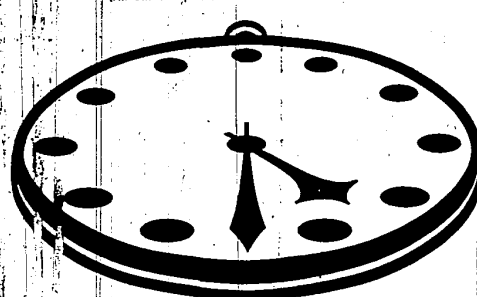
