The United Community Services of Metropolitan Detroit has instituted a special telephone service for the residents of Oakland County.

Simply by calling 647-2335 residents can obtain information about homes and services for the aged; personal and marriage counseling; visiting nurses and homemakers; child welfare; public assistance; recreational services and camps; and health and hospital services.

Named the Community Information Service the project is operated by the United Community Services of Metropolitan Detroit in order to give information on and direct the general public to the health, welfare and recreation services in the community. It is a confidential service, given without charge, by trained social workers.

PTA Council Head Tells About Program

Mrs. Lorraine LeGros has been elected president of the Farmington Area Council of PTA's for the balance of the school year. She replaces Robert Johnson who has resigned because of personal commitments.

Mrs. LeGros stated her belief that many Farmington residents would like to become better informed as to the true aims and policies of the PTA. She noted that the Farmington District Library and the Farmington Senior High library both have subscriptions to the official PTA magazine.



This might be a good source of information, she observed.

Quoting from an issue of the magazine Mrs. LeGros said that "It is extremely difficult to manage a multi-member, nationwide organization from the bottom up. But the PTA tries, and with surprising success."

There is a three-year National PTA Action Program, which consists of suggestions and recommendations, not requirements. The state and local PTA's are free to adopt, adapt or reject any item they see fit. The current Action Program, "Critical Issues in Our Democracy," PTA Steps Toward Great Decisions, was developed through a nationwide poll of PTA leaders and members on what the critical issues are and what PTA's do to help resolve them.

"State By-Laws provide for a turnover of board members by limiting tenure of office and eligibility for re-election. Nominations from the district are always in order. The relationships of the National PTA, the state branches and the local units have developed over the years. It is now proposed that traditional understanding about them be explicitly stated in the National By-Laws."

Enrollment Goes Up at Oakland

A record enrollment for Continuing Education courses has been set again at Oakland University. A total of 2688 adults enrolled in liberal arts, business and professional courses for the fall term which began the week of Sept. 26.

Student enrollment is up 17 percent over last year's fall term figures. There was a 13 percent increase in the number of courses offered, a 44 percent increase in language class enrollment and a 65 percent overall increase in the total for liberal arts classes.

At the present time, 85 business and professional development courses are being held on the Oakland University campus and 37 liberal arts, creative and fine arts and personal development classes. Majority of the classes are held during the evening hours, Monday through Friday.

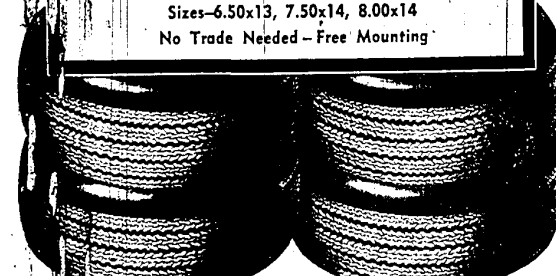
