Cubs Meet New Den Leaders

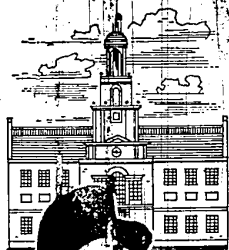
New Den Mothers and Den Chiefs were introduced at the October meeting of Farmington's Cub Scout Pack 118 at the Flanders School.

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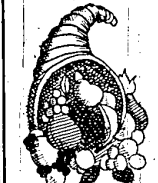
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
