

## Farmington Man's Trial to be Dec. 8 In Circuit Court

John Lee Ott's trial on the charge of second degree murder will begin at 9 a.m. Thursday, Dec. 8, in Judge Clark J. Adams' Court in Pontiac.

Ott, 32, of 22570 Tulane, Farmington, is charged with killing his long time friend, David Garren, 23, of 2755 Whittington, Farmington Township, July 10.

He was arraigned on the charge in the Oakland County Circuit Court Oct. 5. According to the police the shooting occurred about 1 a.m. during a party at Garren's home. According to reports Ott demanded payment of \$50 which Garren allegedly owed him for help on a house painting job.

At that time Garren allegedly fired one shot from a .22-caliber pistol, hitting no one and Ott fell. He returned, shortly thereafter
