Prevent Soil, Stay Ahead!

Whenever you can prevent soil, you're that much ahead of the clean-up game. Cooperation of family members can make a big difference, especially when they start going outdoors more.

Keep dirt out of the house with hard-surface walks and paths. Sweep walks, steps, and porches frequently. Buy fabric and materials that are easiest to maintain.

And if the kids still track mud on the bath mat, one bureau of bleaching information suggests tossing it in the washer. Wash with a cup of liquid chlorine bleach (diluted first in a quart of water) has been added. However, if hang-tags do not specify whether the dye is bleachfast, check first by using the stain-removal solution on an inconspicuous portion of the garment.
