Campaign Over . . . About The Expenses

BILLIE S. FARNUM

Contributors to Billie Farnum's campaign in the general election this fall, pitched in over \$27,000 in an unsuccessful attempt to return the 19th District freshman congressman to the Democratic fold. Expenses are expected to be slightly more.

Farnum in his own personal report listed receipts of \$5,467 and disbursements of \$6,857.

Major sources of the dollars were the Redford Citizens for Farnum Committee which donated \$600; Democratic National Committee, \$1,150; Fans for Farnum, \$7,200; and Farnum for Congress Committee, \$4,900.

Major expense items in Farnum's personal report were for telephone calls, \$1,600; and airline travel, \$600.

Eldon C. Rosegart, treasurer of the Oakland County Democratic Committee, reported receipts of \$7,225. Of this amount, \$3,000 came from the Oakland County Council Voluntary Contribution Fund; \$2,225 from the Congressional Dinner Committee; and \$2,000 from the Michigan State AFL-CIO.

He noted that he disbursed \$6,431, mostly for advertising expenses.

Edward H. McNamara, Livonia City councilman and treasurer of the Redford-Livonia Farnum for Congress Committee, showed receipts of \$2,484.

He listed an amount of \$500 received from the D.S.G. 1966 Campaign Fund, Silver Springs Md., Rita A. Morgan, treasurer. The Democratic Congressional Committee in Washington, D.C., contributed \$500 and the United Steel Workers of America gave the same amount.

No disbursements are listed on the report but McNamara told this newspaper this was because bills had not yet been received. He said he expected total costs, mainly in telephone bills, would be roughly \$3,000.

Disbursements and contributions for Fans for Farnum and Farnum for Congress were not available at the time this story was written.
