Later he attended the Evangelical Lutheran Seminary at Columbus, O., and now is serving Gracious Saviour Church and at present is the Lutheran representative to the Metropolitan Detroit Council of Churches Radio and TV department. He also is on the Board for the 450th Reformation Anniversary Year.
