

Ex-Senator Robinson Named to Head New Catholic Church Department

Edward J. Robinson, who represented Redford Township in the Michigan State Senate from 1964 to 1968, is chairman of the newly established Catholic Archdiocese Community Affairs Department.

His appointment was announced last week by Archbishop John F. Dearden of Detroit.

Robinson, 33, was an industrial personnel specialist in Dearborn before serving in the legislature.

In his new job he will represent a merger of three existing archdiocesan programs.

They are the Human Relations division, which directs both project commitment and equality, the Human Resources division, which will continue to operate the Archdiocese anti-poverty program, and the Housing and Urban Development division.

Robinson, who will have offices in the Gabriel Richard building in Dearborn, said the objective of his department would be "to represent the people of the Archdiocese to government, industry, labor, other religions, minority groups and the general public on matters relating to the general welfare."

He added that he would concern himself particularly with involving the laity and the religious at a local level in the goal-making and goal achieving process.

Robinson said the department hoped to set up in each parish a community affairs committee, which eventually would function as a regional community affairs board.

Robinson is a graduate of Dearborn Sacred Heart High School and received his bachelor's degree in Economics from Notre Dame University in 1957.

He is currently studying for a law degree in night classes at the Detroit College of Law.
