Bebe Lindhout of Livonia Is Named To Head Northwest YWCA Board

Mrs. William P. Lindhout, installed Monday as chairman of Northwest Branch YWCA looks forward to an exciting year.

"We will be building a swimming pool and additional facilities as well as developing new programs," said Mrs. Lindhout. "We have confidence that the people will support us in this venture because the need is so great."

Other Livonia women elected to the Northwest Board of Management are Mrs. Arthur Jenkins, Mrs. Fred Beal, and Mrs. Olson Hensley.

Officers elected with Mrs. Lindhout include: Mrs. Charles Siles and Mrs. Lawrence Near of Detroit, first and second vice-chairmen; Mrs. L. P. Terry of Northville, recording secretary; and Mrs. Joseph Hensley of Redford Township, corresponding secretary.

Other new board members are Mrs. Robert Albertson, Detroit; Mrs. Blake Couser, Northville; Mrs. James Nugent, Redford Township; Mrs.

Robert Shannon, Detroit, and Miss Dora Yeager, Detroit.

With the expansion program the YWCA anticipates an addition that will more than double the size of their present building at 25940 Grand River. The present building was completed in 1959 when the Northwest Branch counted 2,000 members. In the past seven years the membership has grown to over 7,000; the building has been used by members as well as outside groups who rent space increasingly.

The tremendous growth pattern of the Northwest Branch reflects the population growth of northwest Detroit cited as the fastest growing suburban section in the nation.

The YWCA first opened its doors—two rather best-up doors—in an old store building at Argos Ave. in Redford in 1952. Then called the northwest "center," it was sponsored by Northern Branch in High-

land Park. The Northwest Branch then joined with the Metropolitan Detroit YWCA in 1958 with 1,559 members and is now metropolitan Detroit's largest branch.

Mrs. Lindhout, the incoming chairman, lives at 37655 Margaret. She was weekly reporter for LIVING LIVE WIRE in the Observer for two years and is currently a member of Livonia's Charter Commission. She has been active in the YWCA since 1955.

Mrs. Jenkins, 3210 Five Mile, has served as secretary

and committee chairman at the YWCA. She is president of the Riley P-TA, has been active in her church, St. Andrew's, and in many community programs—LYI, Dollars for Scholars, and Schoolcraft College.

Mrs. Olson Hensley, 11531 Cavell, long active in Livonia civic affairs, is at present chairman of the Northwest Region American Red Cross. She has been on Livonia's library commission and chairman for the March of Dimes.

Mrs. Fred Beal of 32136 Hees, has for many years been with the Y-W Wives Clubs in Livonia. She has worked with P-TAs at both Whitman Junior High and Grant Elementary School.

Alpha Xi Delta Offers \$1,500 Grant

Alpha Xi Delta, national social fraternity for women, is again offering a \$1,500 graduate fellowship for advanced study in the field of social service.

The annual award was first made in 1959 and Alpha Xi Delta is continuing to offer it because it concurs with most civic authorities and juvenile court officials that there is an increasing need for trained personnel to work with youngsters.
