Board Handles Site Matters

Site problems occupied two important places on the Jan. 10 Board of Education agenda.

Decisions were made on a highway granting access through the area of vacated Powers road from the expressway North. It also was decided to hire an engineering firm to survey property in Section 13 in order to get a roadway to a school site which presently is landlocked.

The School Board has been concerned over maintaining the pedestrian overpass at the expressway and Power Rd. so that there would be an easement for residents north of the expressway to get to the Community College and also for children south of 1696 to get to Dinkel Junior High. The approved plan calls for a 12 foot easement through the property between 12 mile and the expressway where multiple dwellings now are being constructed.

The survey work being done in Section 13 is to establish boundaries so that there will be 40 feet for a roadway to be built granting access to a school site on the north side of the expressway which presently is landlocked. The adjacent Sisters of Mercy have agreed to an easement across their property.

Dead Man Leaves No Survivors

The 70-year-old Farmington Township man who was found dead in his trailer Dec. 28 was buried Jan. 4 in North Farmington Cemetery.

Frank Berlinger of 25720 Orchard Lake Rd. had no surviving relatives. Born in Minnesota, he had lived in Farmington Township all of his life.

An Army veteran, Berlinger had been employed for the last eight years as a janitor for the Transformer Inspection Company of Royal Oak.

Police said that his death was due to natural causes, but that Berlinger had been dead for several days.

Language Classes Slated At 10 Mile

The third series of foreign language classes sponsored by the Farmington 10 Mile School PTA will begin Saturday, Feb. 4, and run through Saturday, April 22.

Beginning and intermediate Spanish will be offered to children from the second through sixth grades in any Farmington public or parochial school.

The series, like the two courses previously offered in 10 Mile, included 10 Saturday morning classes of half-hour duration. There will be no classes March 23 and April 1 during Easter vacation.

Qualified language teachers have been engaged, and children in grades two and three will be separated from the older students in each language and level.

A minimum of 14 students has been set for each class, and registration must be made by Jan. 20. The fee per student is \$8, and checks may be made payable to the 10 Mile PTA and mailed to Mrs. Robert D. Allaben, language program chairman, at 33000 Biddlestone Lane, Farmington. Allaben at 476-6377.

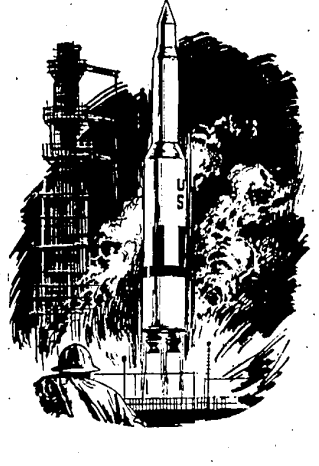
