field of baggage movement for the airlines.

In fact, a meeting is scheduled for Tuesday, Jan. 24, with the Air Transport Association to explore the matter. Murphy told The Observer that "it appears that the system will be adopted by all U.S. airlines" after this meeting.

area of the Township.

Purposes of the Council are to:

• Prevent further annexation or formalization of the Township;  
• Preserve the Township's zoning plan basis for community development with controlled population density;

• Assure the continuance of the present policy of charging sewer, water and pavement improvements to the owners benefited, and to oppose the use of general tax funds for these purposes;

• Encourage the development of the Township's industrial park and other good tax-base properties so as to lessen the tax burden to the homeowner; and

• Improve the maintenance of Township roads and traffic safety.

The Council points out that in order to gain time to accomplish the purposes of the group and to prevent further annexation attempts it was necessary to file petitions to incorporate as a

The guidelines, by which the Council seeks to "promote the orderly development of Farmington Township as an outstanding residential community," and "provide for the protection of our rural atmosphere," maintains reasonable property taxes," are:

• Maintain the Township's present low tax rates;  
• Maintain the present zoning with controlled low population density through large lot sizes;

• Well planned and rigidly enforced development of the Township's light industrial park and other good

tax contribution properties;

• The continuation of the policy of payment of improvements by the land to be benefited.

Under the state law the County Board of Supervisors will set the election date as the next general election is not scheduled until Aug., 1968.

Reaction to the filing of the petitions were varied. W. V. Brotherton, mayor of the City of Farmington, termed the action as "not unexpected."

Charles W. Stevenson, president of the Village of Quakertown, told The Ob-

server, "I think this will present a real problem to the areas excluded. They will have to assume the responsibility of operating as a Township and provide police and fire protection as well as assessment facilities. They will also have to assume a portion of the debts of the present Township with no compensating revenue. I am specifically referring to the Township-wide obligation for the interceptor sewer."

The president of the Village of Wood Creek Farms, Norman H. Kreider, said that he had been out of town and really didn't have much to say about the matter at this time.

"We were opposed to Township wide incorporation before and were not consulted prior to the filing. We were not consulted this time. We like our identity as it is and this is what we have been striving to maintain," Kreider commented.

Farmington Township Supervisor Curt Hall said that "The administration was in favor of incorporation on the first attempt and certainly our minds haven't changed. How can we have a planned community for the future when we don't know what our boundaries will be?" he asked.
