Police officers were told that a car driven by Stanley Harper, 43, of 2133 Wilmer, was making a left turn from Ford onto Wilmer when it was struck by an auto driven by Barbara Dempsey, 18, of 4495 Venoy, Wayne.

Injured were the two drivers and Miss Dempsey's three passengers, Dorothy Lemieux, Josephine Jaldatz, 18, and Carol Duchin, 18, all of Dearborn.

The five were taken to Wayne County General Hospital by the Westland Fire Department's rescue wagon.

Miss Dempsey told police that she pulled out of a gas station at Ford and Newburgh Roads when another motorist flashed his headlights at her. As she reached for her headlight switch, she struck the Harper car.

Both Miss Dempsey and Harper told police that they didn't see the other car. No ticket was issued by police.

Will Head Automotive Engineers

Ralph H. Isbrandt, vice president, Automotive Engineering Staff, of American Motors Corp., Detroit, has been elected 1967 President of the Society of Automotive Engineers. Isbrandt resides at 14874 Fox Road, Redford Township.

Isbrandt-designed cars were among the first to incorporate two independently-functioning braking systems and other safety-oriented constructions only recently accorded widespread public interest. He has achieved recognition throughout a wide range of automotive engineering. During World War II, as vice-president and general manager of Fieseler Aircraft Co., he led an operation which produced wings for the U.S. Air Force. After the war, Isbrandt became chief chassis engineer of the Kaiser-Frazer Corp. In 1953, he rejoined Nash Motors as chief design engineer, having first been affiliated with American Motors' predecessor in 1929.
