Sex Education Group To Be Formed Soon

The first members of a committee which will help develop a sex education program in the Wayne Community-School District will be appointed within the next two weeks.

The department of instruction of the district, which includes most of Westland, will select persons from a variety of fields to serve on the committee.

Approval was granted by the school board recently to accept the department's recommendation to let the staff move ahead with the "necessary research and study to develop a curriculum guide in sex education for the school district."

Dr. Orval M. Conner, assistant superintendent for instruction and Raymond H. Lafrey, the language coordinator, commented to the school board that while "ideally" (sex education) should probably be carried out within the home but realistically, we know this isn't happening. The school is the only institution

which reaches all children and the evidence of need for this program is known and recognized by many responsible citizens."

To recognize personal differences regarding this matter, the two administrators continued, the committee should study the advisability and propriety that exists for both individuals and schools who are "not prepared" to accept the program. They also pointed out that "attention should be given to legal requirements regarding sex education in Michigan."

In providing background for the issue, the pair said that in the past few years, "several local PTA's in the school district have supported efforts to provide some formal presentation of information regarding sex education within the framework of the public school."

"This has not been a new venture for PTA. This effort was carefully guided by Mrs. Olive Shale, director of nurse-

ing services, and building principals.

"The programs were well received and, while not totally adequate, they served to pave the way for a more comprehensive and responsible approach to the problem."

"Because of the nature of this issue, it can be anticipated that great care and attention will be required to insure that we evolve a development program which is both explicit and accurate. It is envisioned that teachers and administrators will need time to research, study, and develop such a program using local resource people as an advisory council for the study."

The proposed structure of the advisory group would include representatives of not only elementary, junior high, and senior high schools, but also the clergy, medical, legal, and sociological fields, school administration, parents, PTA, the school district's special services department, which includes nurse, visiting teachers, and social workers.
