

(Continued from Page 1) Board again at its next regular session Feb. 13, Farmington Township Supervisor Curt Hall told The Observer that he was "only one of seven men, but I think the rezoning will be approved by the Township Board."

"At the Jan. 23 meeting, the Board approved rezoning unanimously."

In its action the Planning Commission made it plain that it preferred the residential zoning on the corner, but that since the corner had said that this was not proper, then the office classification was the next choice.

A final court decision on the suit filed by Brown is expected on Feb. 13 by Oakland County Circuit Court Judge Arthur Moore.

The Planning Commission also recommended that:

Four lots in Kemberton Park be rezoned from light industry to residential. These lots are currently being used for industrial purposes, but by this action the Township stops any expansion of the existing industries.

A total of 20 lots on Orchard Lake Rd. be rezoned from residential to RC2 (multiple) and two other lots in the area be rezoned to office.

Under a proposed amendment to the zoning ordinance private clubs and lodges would be allowed in these classifications. This gives the



This complaint was fully justified," Peter B. Spivak, Commission Chairman, said. "And with the most recent traffic count showing almost 3,000 vehicles per 24 hours, it is reasonable to assume that such a crossing bump presents a true hazard to motorists."

At the same time, the Commission ordered the existing flashing-light signals to be modernized commensurate with the traffic requirements at the crossing.
