ANN ARBOR—The Alumnae Council of the University of Michigan is sending birthday greetings to all Michigan alumnae in honor of the University's 150th year.

The annual greeting cards, originated five years ago by Mrs. Oliver Dewey Marks of Birmingham, are used to raise funds for the Alumnae Council.

Recipients are asked to pay a penny-per-year of the University's existence—or \$1.50 in this sesquicentennial year.

Proceeds are used in various Alumnae Council projects. This year the money will go for the final payments on a three-year pledge to help finance the University's Center for Continuing Education for Women.

Mrs. Marks, who is chairman of the birthday greeting effort this year, revealed that a winter scene showing the William L. Clements Library on the U-M campus illustrates the cards. The design was executed by Dorothy Jaqua of Grand Rapids.

Mrs. Bernard Siebers of Grand Rapids, Council ways and means committee chairman, said the greetings are expected to be in the mail by Feb. 1.

Ben F. Bregi, president of National Branch & Machine Company, has been named to the Lawrence Institute of Technology Board of Trustees. It was announced by Dr. Wayne H. Buell, LIT president.

He becomes the ninth member of the Board in control of the college at North Western and Ten Mile in Southfield.

Bregi, a Grosse Pointe Shores resident, is one of Lawrence Tech's most distinguished alumni. He graduated in 1937 with a bachelor's degree in mechanical engineering and received the college's first Alumni Achievement Award in 1952.

After joining National in 1933, Bregi rose through various engineering and administrative positions and was named president last year.

The firm is the world's largest manufacturer of gear shaving and honing machines, with design and manufacturing facilities in Detroit and Coventry, England.
