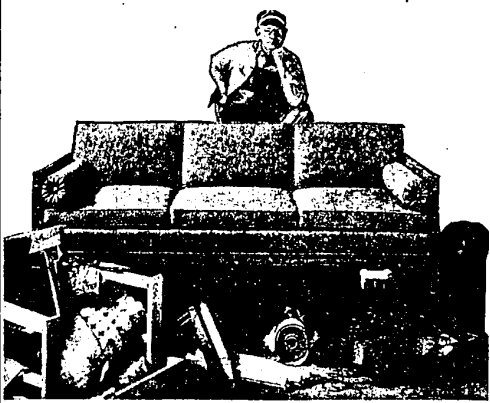

SHIRLEY FORD

One of Farmington's busiest artists has a special reason for pride during this Lenten season.

Mrs. Blaine Ford has learned that the head of Christ she painted in 16 hours on Good Friday three years ago now is hanging over the altar in the new bell tower at Concordia College at St. Louis. It will be dedicated at Easter time.

Shirley Ford's deep-toned, intense oil painting created quite a star among many local residents who had known her for her pastel portraits of Farmington children, her flower arrangements and decorations, her work with Girl Scouts and at hospitals.

George Ramsay, her minister at the First Presbyterian Church in Farmington said of it:

"In realism has been caught the agony, the tenderness, the strength, the patience, the kindness, the humility of real love."

The painting was purchased recently by Mr. and Mrs. H. Freundt of Orchard Lake Road and presented by them to the Lutheran Church, Missouri Synod, seminary, Shirley hopes to get there to see her work in its place of honor — when she finds a few spare minutes.

For, at this point her life is pretty well filled with such matters as a full-time job as art therapist at Northville State Mental Hospital, more pastel portraits, singing in her church choir and in the Farmington High School and Community Chorus presentation of "The Holy City," and membership — in Shirley's case it's always active membership — in the Farmington Historical Society, the Girl Scout Council and the Hill and Dale Garden Club.

Her work at Northville among the mentally ill and emotionally disturbed patients was on a volunteer basis for two years. In the spring of 1955 she put on

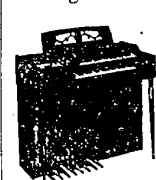
