

## Farmington Dems Active at Parley

Farmington might be a community which traditionally elects Republicans, but the minority Democrats were much in the limelight when the Dems gathered in Grand Rapids over the weekend for their state convention.

Aldo Vagozzi of 26193 Killartan, Farmington Township, was named chairman of the 19th District Democratic organization. This is the first time that the District has unified under one chairman. Previously the District had two organizations—one for Wayne County and one for Oakland County.

Another Farmington resident — Margaret Halava of 23095 Fleming was a candidate for State Vice Chairman. She was subsequently elected to the District's executive committee.

Bill Hungerford of 22231 Cass was the 19th District's representative on the Convention's Resolutions Committee.

The Farmington delegation was led by Gerald Freedman of 21917 Treadwell. Freedman is chairman of the Farmington Democratic Club.

A total of 10 delegates from the community attended the convention.
