A congressman recently announced that he intends to introduce a bill to raise the rates on mail other than first class to elimin-ate this "subsidy."

Wilhelm, comments:

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"The appeal of the 'mail' subsidy' argument is very strong for people who find it annoying to receive junk mail. There are many people in the economy who are opposed to advertising and they find direct mail advertising annoying. The idea of raising the costs of direct mail is appealing to such groups.

"Actually, however, the argument that the junk mail is being subsidized by low rates is quite questionable, and a strong argument can be put forth that the first-class mail is the one being subsidized and not the junk mail.

Will he im say, is whether itse Post Office Department could signifi-cantly reduce its costs and personnel if it did not have to carry any mail other than first class. If it could not eliminate post offices, mailmen, trucks, or sort-ing personnel, costs would remain about the same.

Unless these costs could be red uc ed, "then there would be nothing gained by eliminating or reducing the junk mail and, indeed, the losses of the Post Office mould be even larger than they are now," the U-M commist declare of the Post Office it is difficult to see how the department could eliminate many post offices or many postal trucks if it had to carry first class mail only," he adds.


