### Color Change Cloth New for Home Decor

Chameleon cloth, the color-changing fabric, may be the answer to the home decorator's dream of adding settings without changed cost.

University of Illinois textile professor Lawrence Trebilcock explains that this printed cotton fabric can be given a second set of colors if you get tired of the original.

First used for little girls' dresses, chameleon cloth is now available in quilted bed-spreads.

Wear, use, or laundering won't change the first color. It changes only once—when you dip the item in a special chemical (ferric acid solution). This solution removes the ultraviolet blue dye, causing a permanent color change.

And the second color isn't a matter of chance. For example, blue becomes green, orchid changes to rose, and brown turns to orange—and stays that way.
