### Rejects Spending Plan Editor:

At a recent meeting of the Plymouth Board of Education, with other officials concerned with plans for, and cost of, school properties, that would be needed in the near future to provide grade school education to an ever expanding student population, much interesting information was provided and some thought provoking ideas expressed.

One speaker wondered how much industrial area was available for occupancy, not particularly for the employment, and resulting increase in incomes for people, but primarily as a prospective source of tax income. Another speaker suggested that a portion of the expense of obtaining land, for future school building sites, that might be used for "recreation" for pupils, teachers and the general public, could be retrieved by applying for a Federal grant or kickback. This idea was endorsed by Gerald Fischer on the grounds that the Federal Government had collected taxes from this area and, therefore, some of it should be given back to the school board.

The majority of people do not understand that all taxes levied on industrial and commercial business concerns have to be included as part of costs of products sold with the result that the final consumer of such product pays these hidden taxes. When business concerns cannot compete with other concerns, less burdened with local taxes, they go out of business or move away, creating unemployment problems.

The idea of allowing the Federal Government to collect taxes—or borrow funds at interest—to return to State or local Governments under terms dictated by Federal politicians, and under conditions which interfere with the rights and powers of the people to decide how much they can afford to pay in taxes, what kind of public facilities or services they consider necessary and are willing to support and pay for, to the end purpose that Government and school officials shall be subservient to the will of the people, requires careful attention and action on the part of taxpayers.

The people of every school district have the obligation to provide all children with an adequate opportunity to an education that will enable them to think and reason and thereby obtain an understanding of the circumstances and forces which intimately affect their lives and means of earning a living, and of subjects that involve their responsibilities as citizens.

Public officials have no authority to provide palatial buildings or "frills" in education, at tax payer's expense, beyond the financial ability of tax payers to provide the money, without going into debt, and such action is unnecessary.

If our school boards would give as much attention to the kind of "education" that our children are getting as they give to other school matters, perhaps the majority of high school graduates would have acquired some measure of knowledge that would enable them to assume adult responsibilities.

Just a casual look at economic, political and social conditions existing in these United States is convincing proof that our schools and colleges have not taught students the truth on economic, political and social subjects that would enable them to understand what has been and is going on in these areas.
