Women on the GO!

It's happened more than once in Livonia.

A young mother, a graduate of Bentley High School, takes her kindergarten to the corner for her first ride on the school bus.

The figure behind the wheel is familiar, and she knows she's seen that driver's face before.

"Why," she gasps in sudden recognition, "you're Mrs. Searies. You were my bus driver when I went to high school!"

The reason it's happened more than once is that Mrs. Phyllis Searies has been driving Livonia children to school for more than 17 years.

She has had the longest service of any non-certified employee of the city school system, and a surprise party at the transportation offices made note of that fact this month.

"I tell you workers' thoughtfulness in throwing the party explains one of the reasons Mrs. Searies thinks she has a pretty fine job. She feels she has good people to work with—and she means everyone from school administrators, Bill Bedell, Ron Upton and Mac Vickers, to the other women who drive buses, to the mothers and children on the routes she works."

Mrs. Searies this year drives youngsters from Whittier Junior High and Cooper elementary—with top seniority she picked that route because it's near the home she shares with a daughter and two pet poodles. She admits the going got a bit tough in this snowy winter.

"Several times I had to dig cars out of the snow so I could keep the bus going," she recalled. "And I hope the parents understood that the school bus is bound to be late on bad days."

There have to be funny incidents in the life of a school bus driver. Like the time the small boy asked Mrs. Searies how old she was.

"Thirty-plus," she hedged. That didn't quite satisfy the next child in line. He

wanted to know, "Plus what?"

Mrs. Searies took another kindergarten class on a farm field trip, and found it was up to her to open a barn door while she had several small charges in tow.

"Just inside was the biggest bull I've ever seen," she remembers. He was penned, but still pretty terrifying, and neither she nor the children tarried long at that barn.

Probably Mrs. Searies' most embarrassing moment as a driver came recently when she led a caravan of 15 buses taking high school students to a musical event.

"The kids were singing, and I got so interested listening to them that I missed the place where I was supposed to turn. And then trying to get back I made another wrong turn."

"Of course all 14 other buses followed, and the rest of those drivers won't let me forget it to this day. But the principal was wonderful. He said everyone's entitled to one booboo."

In Mrs. Searies' 17 years on the job, there haven't been many.

Even Veteran Cooks Can Overcook Chicken

URBANA—Even a novice cook can get gourmet results when preparing today's tender young broiler-fryers if she remembers one important fact—chicken can easily be overcooked.

Chicken breasts often become dry and chewy because they cook quicker than the thicker parts, such as the legs.

When cooking cut-up chicken, give the legs a 10-minute head start before adding the breast, suggests Geraldine Acker, University of Illinois foods specialist.

She offers these additional suggestions:

If the chicken is to be fried, broiled or oven-browned, be sure to pat it dry after rinsing in cold water because a wet surface will not brown properly.

Broiler-fryer parts or cut-up chickens usually take an hour to cook in a moderate oven; pan-fried, deep fried or broiled parts cook in 30 to 45 minutes depending on the size of the parts.

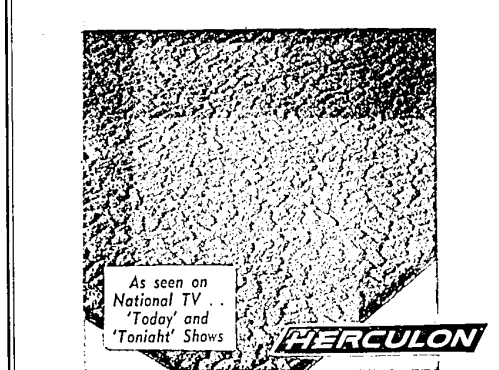
