State Senator Basil W. Brown, of Highland Park, will speak at the Livonia Citizens for Better Human Relations meeting Sunday, April 9 at 8:30 p.m. in St. Matthews Methodist — EUB Church, 30900 Six Mile Rd.

He will discuss the controversial open housing bills which will go before the Senate this year.

Senator Brown has readied and introduced the comprehensive bundle of civil rights bills which aim to eliminate discrimination in housing transactions involving home owners as well as real estate brokers, and to outlaw "block busting" in fact as well as in advertising.

Standards of integration in urban renewal and highway development would be established and municipalities could enact their own civil rights ordinances if these suggested bills are passed.


