IT IS HEREBY ORDAINED by the Township Board of the nship of Farmington, Oakland County, Michigan:

That Section 1409, Subsection 3, of said Ordinance No. 29, of the Township of Farmington, as amended, is hereby amended in the following particulars:

SUBSECTION 3 TANLES COURTS. Because of the effects of trailer coarts on traffic, and insymuch no trailer Routs constitute a business use of land for the storage of transpart rotation coaches, such courts are operated commercially and shall be excluded from any "R" district, and may be permitted only in a "B-3" General Business District upon the approval of the offert in the sectived a recommendation from the Planning Commission. Trailer Courts shall further be subject to the following conditions:

- Trailer courts shall not be permitted within one thousand (1,000) feet of a residential district unless eighty (80) percent of the property owners within one thousand (1,000) feet agrée to said trailer court development.
- The trailer court site shall be enclosed by a fifteen (15) foot greenbelt adjacent to all abutting properties and public rights-of-way. The greenbelt shall be located within the trailer court site and shall provide a continuous year around obscuring screen.

  An open area shall be provided on each trailer coach lot to insure adequate natural light and vertilation to each trailer and to provide sufficient area for audiour test estendid to the excupants of the motiver coach and \$1,000 square feet in order parts which the excupant is the trailer coach and \$1,000 square feet in order parts used of drivers, open spoce in the trailer coach or other open areas not seen filedly for trailer coach occupancy. The minimum width for trailer coach occupancy, The minimum width for trailer coach lots shall be thirty-live (35) feet.

(g) Each trailer coach site shall have the following minimum yard requirements: Side Yard ten (10) feet Rear Yard eight (8) feet Front Yard ten (10) feet

- Front Tard' Len (10) ret). No trailer cooch shall be located closer than twenty five (25) feet from any building within the court or any property line bounding the court. No building or trailer cooch shall be located closer than twenty five (25) feet from any public street right-lowy one fless thom forty (40) feet from any major thorafore (section) line roods and including Grand Reve, North-western highway and Expressivelys.
- (i) Two (2) hard surface automobile porking spaces shall be required for each troller cooch site. Off-street spaces shall meet the minimum requirement of Sections 1404 and 1505 where applicable.

Service Drives and Sidewalk Requirements

(1) Trailer cooch lots shall abut a service drive. All service drives shall be constructed of black top or poured concrete within one (1) year after issuance of permit. (2) Trader courts shall provide an approved hard surface entrance road not less than thirty (30) feet wide, also contingent upon Township Engineer approval.

(3) Schedule of Service Drive Widths:

(a) One-way traffic street with no parking—minimum 16 feet.

(b) Two-way traffic street with no parking—minimum— 24 feet.

(c) One-way traffic street with parallel parking one side—minimum—22 feet.

(d) Two-way traffic street with parallel pa side---minimum—30 feet. (e) One-way traffic street with parallel parking two sules minimum—32 feet.

Parking spaces on service drives shall be clearly marked. All service drives shall be provided with curbs and gutters and be properly drained.

(4) The Trailer Court shall be designed to provide a concrete walk at least thirty six (36) inches wide from entrance of park to all trailer cooch sites and all required service facilities.

(5) Street and yard lights sufficient to permit safe move-ment of vehicles and pedestrians at right shall be pro-vided and shall be so located and shaded as to direct the light away from adjacent properties.

Additional Requirements for Trailer Courts

- (1) There shall not be less than three hundred and saiv (130) square feet of floor space within each traiter (130) square seep of square, and an additional and hundred (130) square feet of floor space for each necessaria

  (2) There shall be provided for each Trailer Court a recention area equal in size to at least two hundred (200) square feet for trailer coach site. Said recreation area shall be no longer than one and one half (11½) simes, it width. Such area shall be graded, developed, vadded and maintained by the management.
- (3) The front yard, and any side yard adjacent in a street shall be landscaped within one year, and the entire trailer court shall be maintained in a good clean, pre-sentable condition at all times.

  (4) No business of any kind shall be conducted in any trailer court except for separate, permanent structures which contain facilities such as the management's office, building and day cleaning facilities or similar uses with the container court of the container court of the container court.
- (6) There shall be no storage of any kind under trailers unless skirted.
- (7) All fences, other than the greenbelt surrounding the court, shall be uniform in height, and shall not exceed thirty (30) inches in height, and shall be constructed in such a manner on to provide firemen access to all sides of each trailer coach.

(n) All trailer court development shall further comply with Act 243 of Public Acts of the State of Michigan, 1959, as amended.

All ordinances and parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed only to the extent necessary to give this Ordinance full force and effect.

The provisions of this Ordinance are hereby ordered to take effect upon publication of the Ordinance in the Farmington Observer, Farmington, Michigan.
