Alfred Robert Gaul's Oratorio, "Holy City," will be performed Friday, April 14, at the Farmington Senior High School on Shawwassee by the Farmington High School Community Chorus and the later-School Orchestra.

A group of 150 persons will appear in the production, which will feature selected soloists. The group is under the direction of William Faessler, Farmington High School Director of Vocal Music.

Tickets for the performance, which may be purchased at the door, are \$1.50 for adults and \$1 for students.

The oratorio is a melodic piece of music and while classic, is not heavy. The ethereal splendor of the work is enhanced by the counter-melodies running throughout the string and wind sections of the orchestra.

While sponsored by the schools, the production is a community-wide project and the cast includes adults as well as students.

Gaul, an English composer, is known for his organ work and was an organist at many cathedrals. He was appointed conductor of the St. Paul Philharmonic Society in 1987.
