# Oratorio Opens Friday

Alfred Robert Gaul's Oratorio, "Holy City," will be performed Friday, April 14, at the Farmington Senior High School on Shiuwassee by the Farmington High School Community Chorus and the After-School Orchestra.

A total of 150 persons will appear in the production, which will feature selected soloists. The group is under the direction of William Faehrer, Farmington High School Director of Vocal Music.

Tickets for the performance, which may be purchased at the door, are \$1.50 for adults and \$1 for students.

The oratorio is a melodic piece of music and while classic, is not heavy. The ethereal splendor of the work is enhanced by the counterpoint strings running throughout the string and wind sections of the orchestra.

While sponsored by a school, the production is a community-wide project and that includes adults as well as students.

Gaul, an English composer, is known for his organ work and was an organist at many cathedrals. He was appointed conductor of the Westall Philharmonic Society in 1937.

# Movie Fans Pick Winners

# Wally Roberts UP GOING CURTAIN

"Hello, Dolly" currently ending its capacity run at the Fisher Theater with Carol Channing in the role that three years ago she originated in the Motor City... has been a much-mentioned musical from its inception.

After a week's rehearsal, back before anyone ever dreamt this musical version of Thornton Wilder's "Matchmaker" would make almost 20 million dollars, Director Gower Champion was ready to drop Carol from the leading role. Champion felt she was all wrong for the part.

Old Wally has always agreed with Director Champion on this point. Mary Martin, Martha Raye, Betty Gravin, Ginger Rogers, have all taken a stab at the role. My favorite, if someone has to do the part, would be Mary Martin. Her maturity and plain features would suit the matchmaker role far better than the vivacious Channing who fairly glows as she goes about her work.

Naturally, my opinion on "Dolly" will be assailed by the thousands that have seen the musical. They are rapturous over seeing "Hello, Dolly." A ticket to this musical has become a status symbol. It's the "in" thing to be able to proudly say, "I've seen 'Dolly' three times."

Wally still feels it is a below average musical. Even a cut of the profits couldn't change my mind about "Dolly." Now, if Carol Channing would change the lyrics of the little song to "Hello, Wally!" my present cantankerous opinion might soften a little.
