

# Teens from St. Matthew's Get Close Look at UN

Thirty-one teenagers from St. Matthew's Methodist Church can qualify now as Livonia's ambassadors to the United Nations.

They have just completed a fun and learning-packed trip to the United Nations in New York.

Traveling by bus and financing part of the trip with funds raised in youth group activities, the students made

a United Nations Seminar the highlight of their six-day trip, but there in some New York sight-seeing for good measure.

Mrs. William Mastny, advisor for the youth fellowship headed the well-organized trip. The Rev. James Lange, one of the ministers at St. Matthew's, and three other adults accompanied the group, which began its trip last Friday evening.

The seminar included a look at the UNICEF headquarters and a visit to the Soviet Union permanent office in the United Nations, with time left free for visits to the UN general assembly to see the organization in action.

Davis will graduate from the seminary May 28.

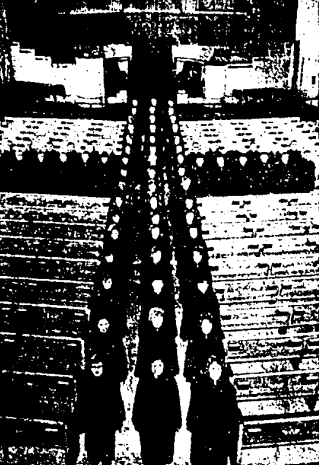
