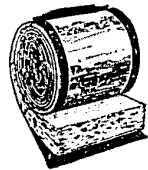

### Farmington YMCA Sets Final Sex Education Program of Year

The third in the Farmington Area YMCA series on sex education will open April 20 at the East Junior High School.

Programs have already been held at Farmington Junior High and the O. E. Dunckel Junior High Schools for the residents of those areas and this last program will serve the residents of the eastern portion of the community.

Instructors in the course, which is designed for junior high youths and their parents, are Dr. Edwin Blumberg, a local physician who is on the staff of Botsford General Hospital and The Rev. Carl Keltzler, pastor of Farmington's Antioch Lutheran Church.

Class sessions are scheduled for April 20, April 27 and May 2. Instruction begins promptly at 7 p.m. and will conclude at 9 p.m. Pre-registration with the YMCA (474-9232) is necessary in order to participate.

A \$3 per family registration fee is charged to cover expenses. The program is sponsored as a community service by the Farmington Area YMCA, as such, is one of the few programs offered by the Y where a membership is not required.

Objectives of the program are:

- To achieve a better understanding of the human body and all its processes.
- To learn of the physiological changes that girls and boys undergo during adolescence.
- To provide a clearer understanding of sex and reproduction; and
- To promote a closer, more comfortable relationship between parents and their youngsters.

The first two sessions are designed for both the youngsters and the parents and will cover the topics of growth and development; emotional changes; maturing socially and spiritually and human reproduction.

A final session is designed for the parents. At this time, the leaders of the program will conduct an informal discussion on how a parent can better communicate and interpret the information provided in the first two classes.

Because of the nature of the subject matter, it is necessary to limit the number of participants. Therefore, pre-registration is a must as the class will be filled on a first-come, first-served basis.

At least one parent from each family must accompany the youngsters participating.

Since the beginning of the sex education program by the YMCA in 1963, more than 1,100 families have participated.

Cost of the pre-schoolers' program is \$1 per week per family.
