Democrats Propose Program For Township Road Maintenance

A four-point program aimed at easing the problem residents face because of bad road conditions has been proposed by the Farmington Democratic Club.

The four-point program was one of the three resolutions adopted at the club's monthly meeting. The group also took a stand in support of present efforts towards establishing a streamlined county governing board and criticized the method by which the Farmington Township Board overrode its bipartisan salary committee in setting the pay of the Supervisor.

The road resolution charged that "too often in the past we have received excuses rather than positive alternatives from our elected officials in regard to the road situation." The Democratic resolution proposed:

- An immediate survey of all the problem roads to determine what needs to be done and what the cost will be.
- A determined effort to obtain all available road funds from county, state and federal sources.
- All-out assistance to those residents who want to take initiative in repairing or paving their roads.
- Keeping the presently paved roads in constant repair before they break up to the extent of having to be repaired at a great cost to homeowners.

The resolution on county redistricting points out that such a move would give the Farmington area a greater voice in county affairs as well as create a more responsive board.

The salary resolution asks that the Township Board resubmit the question of the Supervisor's salary to the committee. "We feel that the recent action by the Township Board in overriding the major recommendation of the Salary Committee in relation to the salary of the Township Supervisor jeopardizes the future working relationship of this committee," the resolution declares.

"The issue is bigger than the \$1,250 which the Township Board added to the recommended \$2,500 salary increase proposed by the committee. The issue is whether the committee is to function as a separate fact-finding group or merely be window dressing for the Township Administration in the difficult area of raising the salary of officials."

In another action the Farmington Democratic Club urged the Legislature to defeat a bill which would allow for the break-up of the Farmington District Library. The proposed legislation, House Bill 2685, introduced by Farmington Representative Raymond Baker, includes the following language:

"Any municipality which has united with other municipalities in the establishment and operation of a district library under this act may withdraw therefrom upon a resolution approved by not less than 75 of the members-elect of the governing or legislative body of the withdrawing municipality."

The Democrats also announced plans for a May 22

dinner in memory of the late Alf Langren, long-time Township resident. Proceeds from the dinner will be donated to the Farmington District Library.

Club Chairman Gerald Freedman announced the appointment of Mrs. Anna Keller to serve on the Township Beautification Committee.

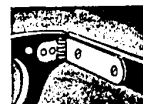
