

# Dr. Frank Laubach Will Speak At Village Presbyterian Church

Dr. Frank C. Laubach, the "Apostle to the Illiterates," will speak at Village United Presbyterian Church in Redford Township, 25350 W. Six Mile Road, at 10 a.m. Saturday, April 22.

For nearly half a century, the name Frank Laubach and his stirring slogan "Each Teach One" have rallied the forces of the free world to the fight against illiteracy, poverty and despair.

Today, Laubach Literacy, Inc. (P.O. Box 131, Syracuse, N. Y. 13210) is continuing his work in an ever-enlarging program.

Because of the lack of a written language, he adapted the Roman alphabet into their dialects and began teaching the native tribes.

"Dr. Frank" is busier than ever. His schedule for 1967 includes final preparation of lessons in Vietnamese to be used in teaching the hordes of refugees in that country. Dr. Laubach plans to go to Viet Nam to personally supervise the program.

In over a hundred countries, millions of illiterate men and women have learned to read by the Laubach method. Thousands have become teachers to their own people, in turn launching successful programs of training teachers in literacy.

Dr. Laubach began his literacy work among natives in the Philippine Islands in 1929.

One of his latest books, "How to Teach One and Win One for Christ," is being sent to a free will offering will be taken.

A graduate of Dartmouth College and the Episcopal Theological Seminary, Cambridge, Mass., he received an honorary degree of Doctor Divinity from Kenyon College in 1966. He came to the Diocese of Michigan in 1949, and until his election as Suffragan Bishop, he served as rector of St. James Church, Grosse Ile.

Bishop Crowley is chairman of the Fair Campaign Practices Commission (State of Michigan); president of the Michigan Council of Churches, member of the Governor's Commission on Human Resources, and a director of Lynn Hospital. He is president of the American Indian Foundation and a member of the Board of Directors of Camp O-AT-KA, Maine.

Dr. Laubach continues, "One of the most satisfying experiences of the last few years has been to see the way in which many voluntary organizations, including many denominations and the United States Government, have been taking a new interest and enthusiasm for teaching illiterate people.

"The War on Poverty in the United States has turned out to be more than half a matter of education—education for productive employment which must begin with literacy." Thirty-five Literacy Committees in 35 states in the United States have been set up and form the itinerary which he is now following.
