Appointment of Miss Jeanette Chamberlain, R.R.L., former Chief Medical Record Librarian at Henry Ford Hospital, as Director of the Michigan Cancer Registry Division is announced by Dr. Michael J. Brennan, President of the Foundation.

Miss Chamberlain will have the responsibility of expanding this central metropolitan Cancer Registry to include every hospital in the four-county area served by the Michigan Cancer Registry, including Wayne, Oakland, Monroe, and Macomb counties. It is designed to assist them with up-to-date record-keeping and data-analysis systems for determining results of treatment of cancer cases.
