

Stempien Is Local Representative to Legislative Group

Marvin B. Stempien, former Democratic Representative, announced that the second meeting of the Legislative Information Committee will be held in Lansing, Thursday, May 4, at 8 p.m. in the Jack Tar Hotel.

The Legislative Information Committee (L.I.N.C.) is an advisory committee to the House Democratic Caucus. It was formed to bring a broader, statewide representation of views on public issues to the Democratic Caucus.

"The first meeting of L.I.N.C. was held in early March," Stempien said. "At that time the Caucus received reports from L.I.N.C. on the views of the people in my district and reports were given by Representatives on the status of important bills in the Legislature."

"L.I.N.C. also agreed to undertake a campaign to encourage voter registration. At that time it was announced that the immediate goal of the campaign is the re-registration of every voter whose registration was cancelled because he failed to vote in the 1966 elections."

"This is the second in a series of meetings to be held between the House Democratic Caucus and former Democratic State Representatives."
