Orthodox Catholic Easter Will Be Marked in New Local Church

The Feast of the Resurrection, to be celebrated by Orthodox Catholic churches Sunday, April 30, will have a special meaning this year for members of that faith living in this area.

For the first time, they will hold their orthodox Easter services in their local church—St. Innocent, located at 23300 West Chicago, Redford Township.

About 40 families that united efforts to organize the new church early this year will join in the Resurrection with their pastor, Father Igor Burdickoff.

Their building was purchased from the Rouge Park Baptist Church, and

the families of St. Innocent parish have spent long hours recently to turn it into a traditional, yet modern, Orthodox church.

The parish had its formal start in March with the Blessing of the Bishop, when Father Igor was officially assigned to the area by His Eminence Archbishop John Wenland.

Father Igor has formerly been connected with the Orthodox Cathedral in New York City and with St. Michael's, in Detroit.

St. Innocent is named for one of the first saints who helped establish the Orthodox Catholic Church in America, and conducts serv-

ices primarily in English. Of particular concern to the parish in its early days are the children and young people among its families. The parish choir that will perform at the Feast of the Resurrection Sunday is made up basically of children.

Regular Catechism classes will be held on Saturday and a vacation Bible school is planned.

Services are held Sunday mornings at 9:30 a.m., with a coffee hour following. Weekday services also are scheduled regularly.

Special Passion Week services include lunch at 9:30 a.m. and 7:30 p.m. Holy Thursday (tomorrow), 7:30 p.m. Holy Friday, 9:30 a.m. Holy Saturday, a midnight service at 11:30 p.m. Saturday and Easter Sunday at 10:30 a.m.

Over the Back Fence

High above our heads nature is staging a floral display. Shade trees dominate the landscape, but their delicate, colorful flowers often go unnoticed and unappreciated.

Bare branches of silver maples are studded with round clusters of yellow-green flowers and clusters of tiny red and orange blossoms. Elms have clumps of red-brown flowers decorating the bare branches and ash trees bear airy upright bunches of tiny blinks.

Poplars have pendulous flower clusters that hang like thick tassels from the bare trees. Hugel cottonwoods have flowers like fat red caterpillars drooping from the tips of the branches and the aspens are adorned with long, slender catkins that sway gracefully in the breeze. Birches, too, have graceful pendants clothing the tree before the leaves unfold.

Willows have flowers in catkins that are held upright. Everyone is familiar with the furry catkins of pussywillow, but other willows have similar catkins. They are generally produced as the leaves come out.

The flowers on many shade trees are produced as they are coming into leaf. Maples get beautiful chestre-uss tassels that blend with the new leaves. Oaks have two kinds of flowers. Seed producing flowers are almost stemless and are tucked close to the branch. Pollen produc-

ing flowers hang in long bright red clusters. Beech and sycamore have pollinate flowers that are like round pom-poms swinging from a long stem.

Trees do more for the landscaping of a home than any other type of plant. They help tie the home to the surrounding landscape and give a settled, established feeling.
