

Nelson Charges Bonds 'Illegal'

Concern over a legal hitch to city installation of water and sewer improvements in annexed Woodcroft Subdivision was voiced Monday night by City Planning Commission member W. Allen Nelson.

Nelson voiced doubts about protection of the validity of the bonds to be sold by the city to finance the improvements.

He claimed the City Council has gone contrary to state law by approving the project for bids before engineers' plans were submitted to the Planning Commission.

spending any funds "to change the present governmental status of the area" during the last incorporation campaign.

David Stader, a member of the Township Planning Commission, said that he was speaking as a private citizen when he proposed that the city make some sort of gesture on its part to show that it was interested in consolidation.

Councilman John Allen noted that the City had been represented at all the study committee sessions and pointed to this as an evidence of city interest in the idea.

Dr. John Richardson, chairman of the study group, asked the government councils if a decision on the committee's request for funds could be reached in two weeks. All agreed and said they would report back to the group.

Farmington Township Supervisor Curtis Hall has been reappointed to two committee posts on the Oakland County Board of Supervisors.

Hall will continue as chairman of the personnel policies committee and as a member of the roads committee.
