Vocational Schools Proposed

On June 12, Farmington school district voters, along with voters in other Oakland County to districts, will decide whether to levy up to a half-mill for an area vocational-technical education program.

This is the second of two articles provided by the Oakland Board on what the proposal is about. Next week we will examine what the proposal will do specifically in Farmington.

Q.Why must we have a separate vocational facility? Why can't we add two, three, or four rooms to each existing high school?
A. Under the Superintendents Task Force Committee recommendations of Structure and Finance, this plan is possible. However, this decentralized program has, a disdavintage of administrative problems, transportation prob-
