

## High Scores Mark Opening Weekend of Observer Merri-Bowl Tourney

# Livonia Duo Fires 1314 to Lead Mixed Doubles

A redhot Livonia duo scorched the alleys at Merri-Bowl Lanes over the weekend to take the early lead as firing opened in the fifth annual mixed doubles tournament sponsored jointly by the Observer News and Paper Group and Merri-Bowl Lanes Manager Mac Goldman.

The team of D. Jean Wilder and Alan Wilder, 36844 Grandon, shot a big 1314 to move into first place at the end of the first weekend.

It marked the first time in tournament history that a pair of 1,000 or better had been registered during the first two nights of bowling.

Mrs. Wilder, who carries a 125 average in a Livonia League had games of 148, 193 and 128 for 469 and Jean, who has a 175 average, opened with 215, came back with 217 after closing with four straight strikes and then wound

up with 203 for a 835. The team received a handicap of 210 pins for the three games and had an aggregate of 1,314.

They needed all of the pins they could get for the day of Helen Masterson and Roy Rynk made a gallant bid for

the lead when they wound up with 1,296. Helen had games of 132, 158 and 114 for 404, far above her 105 average. Her partner, Earl, averaged 215, 189 and 233 for the 637 and the national 252 pins handicap posted the total to 1,296.

Rose and Herbert Forbes had a fine 1,265 with the former getting 463 and the latter 601 with 201 pins handicap.

Vera Henderson and Fred Bertrand had 1,258 and the duo of V. Proctor and C. Proctor landed among the

leaders with an identical 1,258. Firing continues until mid-June when the championship will be crowned.

Meanwhile, Tournament Director Goldman indicated there are still choice times and dates available on most

weekends but urged bowlers to make entry now since most leagues have finished and all bowlers are looking forward to competition in the season end tournaments of which the Observer Merri-Bowl lanes mixed doubles is one of the best.
