Forecasts Trouble for Schools

Sen. George Kuhn (R-14th District) voted against the Detroit, as one of its draw-unamended package when it backs.

This, says Harrison, would simply mean that whereas the Farmington School District normally hires 100-115 new staff members every year as either replacements for outgoing staff members or to fill new positions in the expanding system, there would not be funds this year to hire those needed.

At the prevailing salary rate of approximately \$7,500, almost 100 fulltime staff members would have to be kept from next year's staff. In addition, Harrison notes, changes of a pay increase for the currently-bargaining teachers would be greatly diminished because of insufficient monies.

Other spending cutbacks may have to be made in various school programs.

Harrison also said that the schools expect "1000 new students in the fall. This, with the staff cutback, would provide a serious situation of overcrowding."

Farmington's State Representative, Republican Ray Baker, was among those who voted for the Romney tax plan.
