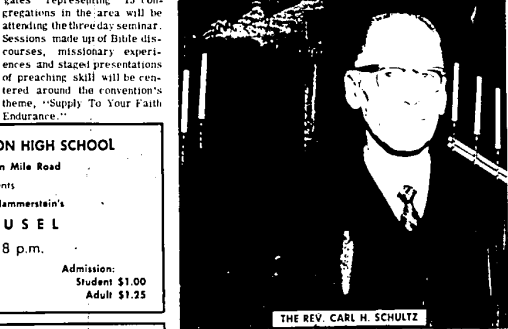

Farmington Churches - Bible Must Apply To Life, Says Pastor



The Rev. Carl H. Schultz, pastor of Salem United Church of Christ in the center of town, says that he and members of the church's adult Sunday school go "round and round" about his approach to his Sunday sermons.

"They say," comments the pastor, "that they want me to take a scripture and tell them what it means."

"But that's not all. If you don't explain how the Bible applies to life. To know the Bible is no good if you don't know the application of it."

"WHEN I SPEAK on Sunday, I deal more with topical meditation, which I try to relate to the scripture and to every day life."

"My approach is not so fundamental that the sermon HAS to begin with a Biblical text."

Feeling the way he goes about the direction a worship service should take, it is fortunate the clergyman is a minister of the United Church of Christ.

It is not specifically a creedal church in the formalism of its doctrine. The direction of a church's worship varies with the individual minister.

Explains Pastor Schultz: "We are a free church. I do not believe in life-lance without organization - just that we are not dictated to. We are a unit in our lives in the locale where we are."

The locale of the Salem church in Farmington is 63 years old. The congregation itself is just 11 years short of being 100 years old.

"FOUNDED in 1878 as a two-point charge (one minister for two churches), members first met in a church near the old Clarenceville Cemetery on Eight Mile."

The local church was built in 1902 and its fittings date from that year. The altar is of carved oak which was so popular at the turn of the century.

A minister for 30 years, Salem's pastor was born in Westphalia, Ind., attended Elmhurst College, Ill., and Eden Theological Seminary in Webster Groves, Mo.

ALTHOUGH HIS congregation is not really small with 325 members, it is a pastor works to keep it from one of his pet phrases - over-organization, or as he terms it - "pro-farmington."

About this, he says, "A lot of this depends on how you're talking about a church - whether as an organization or a group of people. You can get into some large churches where there's turmoil like Grand Central station. Then, basically, much of the purpose of the real church as the body of Christ goes by the wayside."

"Unfortunately, one of the ways a church is judged on its accomplishment is whether it's growing in membership and how it stands financially."

"A balance between the materialistic and the spiritual is hard to strike unless there is a real foundation of Christian principles - not a pietism, but a real concern for Christian benefits."

After his interview was over, he trotted out to the car to say, "I must tell you that my wife Barbara has been responsible for much my family has had. She teaches over at Kenbrook School."

Then he walked away with pride on his face.

2 Space Lectures Presented At East Jr. High

John Soroka, space science demonstrator for the National Aeronautics and Space Administration, gave two lecture-demonstrations at East Junior High April 21.

Soroka is one of many NASA-sponsored lecturers currently touring the United States and several foreign countries to explain this country's role in the "Space Race."

Although restricted mainly to satellites, Soroka's lecture ran the gamut from early Chinese experiments with gunpowder to today's sophisticated rocketry with its micro-miniaturized and transistorized payloads.

The lecture, aided by the scale-model contents of a NASA Space Module, was heard by East Junior's 1300 students. Two identical programs were presented, one for 9th graders and one for 7th and 8th graders.

TOWNSHIP OF FARMINGTON AMENDMENT TO ZONING ORDINANCE
229-26 29
An Ordinance to amend Ordinance No. 29 of the Township of Farmington entitled:
"An Ordinance enacted under Act 184, Public Acts of 1943, as amended, governing the unincorporated portions of the Township of Farmington, Oakland County, Michigan, to regulate and restrict the location and use of buildings, structures and land for trade, industry, residence and for public and semi-public or other specified uses; and to regulate and limit the height and bulk of buildings and other structures; to regulate and to determine the size of yards, courts and open spaces; to regulate and limit the density of population and for said purposes, to divide the Township into districts and establishing the boundaries thereof; providing for changes in the regulations; restrictions and boundaries of such districts; defining certain terms used herein; providing for enforcement establishing a Board of Appeals; and imposing penalties for the violation of this Ordinance."

IT IS HEREBY ORDAINED by the Township Board of the Township of Farmington, Oakland County, Michigan: Section One That the zoning map of said Ordinance No. 29 of the Township of Farmington, as amended, be and the same is hereby amended to show O-Office district classification where R-2 Multiple district classification is now shown in the area described as follows:

Section Two All ordinances or parts of ordinances in conflict herewith are hereby repealed only to the extent necessary to give this Ordinance full force and effect.

Section Three The provisions of this Ordinance are hereby ordered to take effect upon publication of the Ordinance in the Farmington Observer, Farmington, Michigan.

Section Four This Ordinance is hereby declared to have been adopted by the Township Board of the Township of Farmington, County of Oakland State of Michigan, at a meeting thereof duly called and held on the 8th day of May 1967, in order to be given effect in the manner prescribed by law.
