1. The City Manager is hereby directed and ordered to cause to be prepared plans and specifications for said street improvements and a detailed estimate of the cost thereof.

The City Manager is directed to file the same, together with his recommendations as to what part of the cost thereof should be paid by the City at large, and the lands which should be included in the Special Assessment District, and his findings as to the necessity of the improvement and the life thereof, with the City Clerk for his examination.

SUBDIVISION SEWER SPECIAL ASSESSMENT BONDS

Saled bids for the purchase of Richland Gardens No. 3 Subdivision Sewer Special Assessment Bonds, to be issued by the Township of Farmington, Oakland County, Michigan, on any one or more interest payment dates on and after September 1, 1970, at the par value thereof and accrued interest. Notice of redemption shall be given to the holders of bonds called for redemption by publication of such notice not less than thirty (30) days prior to the date fixed for redemption, at least once a week in a newspaper or publication circulated in the City of Detroit, Michigan, which carries as a part of its regular service, notices of the sale of municipal bonds. Bonds so called for redemption shall not bear interest after the date fixed for redemption provided funds are on hand with the paying agent to redeem the same.

The said bonds are to be issued in anticipation of the collection of an equal amount of special assessments against the property in the certain special assessment district, to defray the cost of constructing sewers in said township, and in addition will pledge the full faith and credit of the township for the payment of the principal and interest thereon. The township's taxing power to make such payment is without limitation as to rate or amount.

For the purpose of awarding the bonds, the interest cost of each bid will be computed by determining: (a) the rate or rates specified therein, the total dollar value of all interest on the bonds from July 1, 1967, to their respective maturity and deducting therefrom any premium. The bonds will be awarded to the bidder whose bid on the above computation produces the lowest interest cost to the township. No proposal for the purchase of less than all of the bonds or at a price less than their par value will be considered.

A certified cashier's check in the amount of \$2,600.00 drawn upon an incorporated bank or trust company and payable to the order of the Township Treasurer must accompany each bid as a guarantee of good faith on the part of the bidder, to be forfeited as liquidated damages if such bid is accepted and the bidder fails to take up and pay for the bonds. No interest shall be allowed on the good faith checks and checks of the unsuccessful bidders will be promptly returned to each bidder's representative or by registered mail.

Bids shall be conditioned upon the unqualified opinion of Dickson, Wright, McKean & Cudlip, attorneys, Detroit, Michigan, approving the legality of the bonds. The cost of said legal opinion and of the printing of the bonds will be paid by the Township. There will also be furnished the usual closing papers, including a non-litigation certificate, dated as of the date of the delivery of the bonds. Bonds will be delivered at Detroit, Michigan, or such other place as may be agreed upon between the township and the purchaser.

The right is reserved to reject any or all bids.

Envelopes containing bids should be plainly marked "Proposals for Bonds".
