# St. Colman's Has Many Namesakes

If you've ever wondered just who St. Colman was, after whom St. Colman Catholic Church on Middlebelt was named, you're not about to have your curiosity satisfied.

St. Colman's pastor, Fr. Robert J. Kilcoyne, says there are about 17 saints by that name in Catholic church history.

To top that, Archbishop John F. Dearden has a great friend by that name whom he might have been thinking of when the parish was named.

Fr. Kilcoyne puts it this way: "All the St. Colmans were put in a hat and one was selected."

HE THINKS his church's patron saint was St. Colman of Clonfert (Ireland).

The priest is a fairly recent arrival at the multi-columned church. He came here last year after serving as an assistant to St. Benedict's in Pontiac.

He is St. Benedict's was quasi-scholar, unlike the outright suburban parish of St. Colman. But he comments that parishioners' problems were no different in Pontiac. "People



are people," he says.

Fr. Kilcoyne thinks the Catholic sacrament of confession plays an important role in the close relationship a Catholic has with his church pastor.

"The priest is more approachable that way," he notes.

"The fact that the confessional is 'secret' is of utmost importance. Many do not want to present their priest with their problems outside the confessional.

"The priest learned how to give this help at Sacred Heart Seminary, Detroit, and Mount St. Mary's, Norwood, O. His desire to help his fellow man he feels is a product of home and school influence.

He is not uncertain about the worth of the many changes in Catholicism since the Vatican Council.

"The use of the vernacular in the Mass has helped the people to understand the liturgy of the church. Non-members who might attend a Mass feel more readily at home in services now."

"Dispensing of the obligation to eat no meat on Friday makes for more mature Christians. A Catholic does things now because he wants to, not because he is obligated to."

Commenting on Project Commitment, the Catholic program developed for integration of new social issues, Fr. Kilcoyne says, "Surely under the direction of Arch. Dearden, priests and people alike are endeavoring to make religion, rather than the church, a part of daily life. It is no longer a Sunday morning experience."

"WE BELIEVE man's relationship to God ought to be a daily experience."

Fr. Kilcoyne hasn't quite got his feet on the ground at his new church. He has 600 families with whom to get acquainted.

Of special interest in the program was the showing of the new color film "God Cannot Lie."


"The attendance far exceeded our expectations," Stalina said, "making it necessary to show the film to the overflow audience in the gymnasium and the auditorium simultaneously."
