Father Zaffina, before taking a permanent assignment, will return to St. Alexander tomorrow (Thursday) to say a solemn Mass of Thanksgiving at 7:30 p.m.

The newly-ordained priest is the son of Mr. and Mrs. Dominic A. Zaffina, of Pontiac. He studied at Sacred Heart Seminary and recently completed four years of study in theology in St. John's Provincial Seminary, Plymouth.

For Methodists Reorganization Is Conference Topic

The reorganization of the structure of the Detroit Annual Conference of the Methodist Church and a vote on the merger of the Evangelical United Brethren and Methodist churches are prime topics for the conference's 126th meeting, now in session at Adrian College.

Church Barbecue To Aid Retarded
Five hundred chicken halves will be cooked over a 50-foot open pit in a barbecue sponsored by the young adult class at Calvary Presbyterian Church from 5 to 8 p.m. on Saturday, June 10.

Bishop Dwight E. Loder, spiritual leader of Michigan Methodism, called the conference into special session for the presentation of the Leifler Research Report Tuesday.

The report covered a range of topics: from the number of programs and the size of the church to the geographical boundaries of the seven districts and the Detroit Conference itself.

More than 1,000 delegates, an equal number of laymen and ministers, from 527 Methodist churches in the eastern part of the lower peninsula and the entire Upper Peninsula, will open the

1967 Annual Conference later Tuesday. The laymen's delegation is headed by Mr. Harold M. Karls of Saginaw, Conference Lay Leader. Co-hosts are the Rev. Dr. John H. Dawson, president of Adrian College, and the Rev. Robert R. Ward, pastor of Adrian's First Methodist Church.

Guest speakers include: Bishop Harold R. Heining, Northwestern area of the Evangelical United Brethren Church; Bishop Marshall R. Reed of Onsted, retired bishop of Michigan area; The Rev. J. Harry Haines, general secretary, Methodist

Committee for Overseas Relations. The Rev. Tracy K. Jones, associate general secretary of World Division of the Methodist Board of Missions; Mrs. W. Earle Price, president of Detroit Conference Woman's Society of Christian Workers; Mr. Carl Orndung, Methodist layman from East Berlin, Germany.

During the session Bishop Loder will announce the appointment of ministers to their pastoral assignments for the 1967-68 year; the session will close with a service of ordination of new ministers at 2:30 p.m., Saturday.
