**Meadow Brook Opens Season Ticket Sale**

Season ticket orders for 1967-68 reached 500 at Meadow Brook Theatre of Oakland University, last week, just 15 days after the close of the new theatre's premiere season, announced Treasurer Donald R. Britton.

The 1967-68 Season opens Oct. 6, Britton termed the advance sale "phenomenal this early, in view of the fact that promotional efforts for the coming season are not yet under way."

The John Fernald Company of the Meadow Brook Theatre, professional repertory company in residence at Oakland University, presented five plays for 21 weeks, from Jan. 4 to May 28, and received wide critical acclaim for its first season as Michigan's newest professional repertory organization.

The enthusiastic response to the initial season has encouraged the Company to schedule seven productions for 35 weeks, from October 6, 1967 to June 2, 1968.

The new season includes "The Importance of Being Earnest" by Oscar Wilde; "John Gabriel Borkman" by Henrik Ibsen; "Charley's Aunt" by Brandon Thomas; "And People All Around," a new American play by George S. Klare; Shakespeare's "King Lear"; "No Exit" by Jean-Paul Sartre and "The Firebugs" by Max Frisch, presented as a double bill; and Anton Chekhov's "The Seagull."

Britton said reservations for season tickets are now being accepted. Actual tickets will be mailed after September 15. For information, write Meadow Brook Theatre, Oakland University, Rochester, Michigan 48063.

**Bloomfield Art Show Opens Sunday**

The annual exhibition of selected works from adult art classes will be presented by the Bloomfield Art Association, June 25 through August 5.

The show consists of 80 works including paintings, drawings, lithography, sculpture, weaving and pottery, drawn from the Art Association's 1966 and 1967 classes. Members of the Bloomfield Art Association faculty, selected the outstanding work from each of their classes to be included in the exhibition, and the remaining entries were juried by the nationally known artist, Glen Michaels. Michaels also selected the award-winning pieces.

The Bloomfield Art Association is the only art school in the area which offers university-calibre courses to serious artists who are not working toward a degree. As a result, the students—who come from all over Oakland County—are often working professionals as well as outstanding amateur artists. The quality of the show indicates, in fact, that the difference between the serious amateur and the working professional is often a matter of time, not talent.

**Pianist To Head Off Court Concerts**

Pianist William Dopman, who will open the Schoolcraft College Summer Concert series on Wednesday evening, July 5, is no stranger to the musical audiences in Michigan, especially those in the southeast corner of the state.

The 33-year-old pianist has performed on several occasions with the Detroit Symphony, and, prior to his arriving here as a concert artist, was soloist with the Plymouth Symphony.

In his Schoolcraft appearance, Dopman will renew his acquaintance with Wayne Dunlap, conductor of the Plymouth orchestra and director of the Schoolcraft Summer Music School and Festival.

Dopman had already won four summer scholarships to the National Music Camp at Interlochen when he entered the University of Michigan School of Music to study piano with Benning Dexter and composition with Ross Lee Finney.

During his sophomore year at U. of M., he won two national competitions for soloists: the 1954 Naumberg Foundation and the 1954 Michaels Memorial Awards.
