# Minister Depends On Faith

If sheer faith can build a church, Evangelical Free Church of Farmington should have no trouble taking over the entire corner of Middle Belt and 10 Mile.

Its pastor, the Rev. Carroll Lindman, has the kind of faith that moves mountains.

That this faith has taken command of the life is proven by the fact that Mr. Lindman studied to be an electrical engineer during his college life at Iowa State University.

"I FOUGHT becoming a minister," he says, "I stayed in engineering knowing I would never be an engineer."

After Iowa State and working for a while, he attended Moody Bible Institute and Fuller Theological Seminary, Pasadena.

Mr. Lindman says now, "I'm glad I got my college degree. I needed it to get into the ministry."

But, the decision to devote his life to service of the church was long in the making.

"I came to know Jesus at 17," he notes. "I was aware there was a reality I didn't know. When I was a college I started thinking about life. I became unhappy and lacked peace."

"But according to my Bible, what was happening to me was supposed to happen. But I fought it. I had planned my whole life to be an engineer. I merely endured church like Latin, English and history and loved all the math."

The congregation he leads here in Farmington is tiny—just 23 members. According to the pastor, though, 40 to 50 people usually attend services.

He calls this the usual thing with free churches.

"It's CONTRAST to most churches," says the pastor,

"our people sometimes attend our church for six months to a year before they formally join."

The fellowship of free churches in the United States and Canada has about 60,000 members, but the constituency numbers about 120,000, says Mr. Lindman, "we do not stress members."

The local church is the only so-called free church in the metropolitan area. Its pastor calls it "a pioneer."

He has been here two and a half years and has worked during that time to build membership. "I'm green," he admits. "In building membership, you look for a plan that works. The big thing is meeting people and that takes time."

Recent programs at the church have been devoted to young people, but Pastor Lindman hopes to reach more adults next year.

He has an ultimate dream of setting up a project involving foreign students from Wayne

State University. After college, he worked for three years with foreign students at the University of Southern California and is still vitally interested in them.

In conversation about these various things, the pastor uses frequent quotations from the Bible, which he keeps ready at hand.

HE THINKS the way to promote the Christian ideal is first through exposure to the Bible.

"Then," he comments, "you must have a willingness to accept the Bible. After that, you must ask Jesus to do what he wants with you. I did and found peace I'd never known."

The 23 people the pastor leads with this belief are from about as many different denominations. And in keeping with the "pioneer" tag the pastor has put on the church, they are not just "pew-warmers," as he expresses it.

They have just completed conducting a highly successful vacation Bible school which had to be limited for lack of space, while last year's young people's program was just as successful.

ALL THIS promises success in their future endeavors.

And it is certain that none will miss church Sunday, July 15, Mr. Lindman is to be ordained at 4 p.m. that day by the Rev. Clarence Hinder, pastor of the Bay City Evangelical Free Church, with the Rev. Gordon Kling, superintendent of the Great Lakes district of the church, giving the ordination message.

## Lutherans Plan New Traveler Ministry

"The Sign of the Fish," an experimental service to travelers will be in operation for the first time July 4 weekend.

Antioch and Incarnation Lutheran Churches of Farmington will be among 30 congregations

of the Michigan Synod of the Lutheran Church in America encouraging people to "reuse" their weekend travel at the Traveler's Service Center.

The center will be open from 9 a.m. to 6 p.m. over the holiday weekend with a 10 p.m. closing. Friday, Sunday and Tuesday evenings, coffee, conversation, a supervised play area for children, and the only Michigan showing of "Lutheran Art USA," will be available to give the traveler an interesting rest break.

"Lutheran Art USA" is a special collection of 35 works by 21 artists in all media. The spirit of each work is captured by a large detail photograph and shows how the Christian church has used every means possible to express the Christian faith.

For the traveler who has time for more than a rest stop, there will be continual showings of films, "Parable" from the Protestant pavilion at the New York World's Fair, "A Time for Building," an award winning film produced by Lutheran Film Associates and seen nationwide on television, and "Man for Others," a National Education Television film showing the church in action in communities around the world.

"The Sign of the Fish" ministry is one of several recreation-resort and traveler ministries being conducted throughout the Michigan Synod of the Lutheran Church in America.
