

Schoolcraft Board Re-Elects Fischer

Harold E. Fischer was re-elected to a two-year term as chairman of the Schoolcraft College Board of Trustees of the board; after seating two new members, held its first meeting of the 1967-68 academic year at the college on Monday night.

Trustees also reelected James J. Moehle as vice-chairman; John A. Matusik as secretary and L. Clarke Oldenburg as treasurer.

Fischer represents the Plymouth school district; Mrs. Moehle, a Plymouth resident, is a trustee-at-large; Matusik represents the Clarenceville district, and Oldenburg represents the Garden City district.

Newly elected members to the first meeting as trustees are Dr. George E. Marin, Livonia, who defeated Leroy

Bennett last month for one of the three at-large seats on the board; and Bertram W. Seccord, who succeeds Dr. Gordon R. Forrester as representative from the Northville district. Dr. Forrester did not seek re-election.

Matusik, who was elected with the opposition from Clark, was reelected to his second term on the board. Trustee terms are for six years.

Other members of the board are James W. Buswell, representing the Livonia Public Schools District; and Sam Hudson, Plymouth, trustee-at-large.

The board also reappointed Edward J. Drusinski, Plymouth, as legal counsel for the college and renamed the CPA firm of Sutherland and Robson as college auditors.

Conservatives Ask COG 'Study'

An Oakland County conservative group, hostile to the idea of merging, has urged that local units take no action toward joining the six-county Council of Governments.

The board of the Republican Citizens Committee of Oakland County urged in a statement that there be "a non-partisan study" of the Council of Governments idea.

The statement, issued by President Francis LeVeque, did not say, however, what lines the study should take. Dr. LeVeque said:

"Our statement of principles includes a section on limited government and the concept of

keeping local government as close to the people as possible.

Where we have heard of regional government, it has been a bad proposal. It has taken government further from the people and placed it into the hands of appointed rather than elected officials."

The GOP Citizens Committee is a group of Oakland County conservatives headed by Robert Huber, of Troy.

The statement, issued by President Francis LeVeque, did not say, however, what lines the study should take. Dr. LeVeque said:
