

Schoolcraft Board Re-Elects Fischer

Harold E. Fischer was re-elected to a two-year term as chairman of the Schoolcraft College Board of Trustees at the board's meeting two weeks ago. Fischer, who was elected to the first meeting of the 1967-68 academic year at the college on Monday night.

Conservatives Ask COG 'Study'

An Oakland County conservative group, hostile to the idea of metropolitan government, has urged that local units take no action toward joining the six-county Council of Governments.

The board of the Republican Citizens Committee of Oakland County urged in a statement that there be no non-partisan study of the Council of Governments idea.

The statement, issued by President Francis LeVeque, did not say, however, what lines the study should take. Dr. LeVeque said:

"Our statement of principles includes a section on limited government and the concept of

keeping local government as close to the people as possible. "Where we have heard of other regional government or 'bi-level' government proposals, it has taken government further from the people and placed it into the hands of appointed rather than elected officials."
