

Festival Parade Will Be Biggest Ever

The third annual Founders parade Saturday, July 29, will be the biggest ever. More than 50 units have already been scheduled in the line-up, including nine bands and at least 10 floats, parade co-chairman C.A. Spencer revealed.



THE FESTIVAL PARADE has everything — even clowns. This year's parade will form at 10 a.m. Saturday, July 29, and proceed west on Grand River from the Grand River Drive-In to Farmington Rd. The speakers stand will be located on Grand River just east of the Downtown Center.

ANTIQUE cars from the Farmington Antique Car Club and several clowns will also take part in the parade. Heading the list of dignitaries will be U.S. Senator Phillip A. Hart (D) and 19th District Congressman Jack McDevitt (R). They will speak just east of the Downtown Farmington Center after the parade disperses.

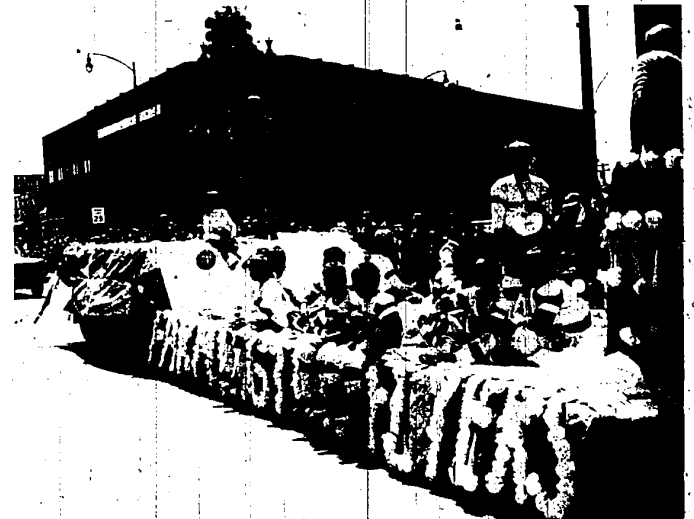

The other bands are: Roseville High School; St. Andrew's Hall, of Ulica; Redford Highlanders; Rochester Highlanders; Praesidium Drum and Bugle Corps, of Detroit; Royal Lancers, of Wyandotte; and the Maybelle Vanettes, of Port Huron.

"I'M SURE that this year's parade is going to be the best we've ever staged," Spencer said, "and I've been co-chairman the other two years, so I can say that." Co-chairman with Spencer this year is Bud Reumo.

"I think there's a greater interest now, especially among people outside of Farmington. In a year or two, we may have to turn away groups that want to participate." Spencer added that he thought the police of both the city and township deserved special credit for their handling of previous parades. "Compared to the situation in most communities, the police here really do a great job."

This year's parade is scheduled for Saturday, July 29. The parade will travel west on Grand River from the drive-in theatre to Farmington Rd. beginning at 10 a.m.

Most of the articles displayed will be for sale. While the majority of the works will be paintings, some crafts displays are also planned. Mrs. Alice Nichols, president of the club, said that it was difficult to estimate the number of artists who might participate.

Temple Cost \$800

In Farmington, where the entire community will celebrate the Farmington Founders Festival in conjunction with the centennial of the incorporation of Farmington as a village on July 27, 28 and 29, it cost taxpayers a total of \$800 for land on which to build their \$43,000 Town Hall.

A sturdy building put to good use by the city, it was available for public and private use at 25 cents per meeting—provided, of course, the renters furnished their own firewood and lights. That was in 1876.

The building now serves as the Masonic Temple.
