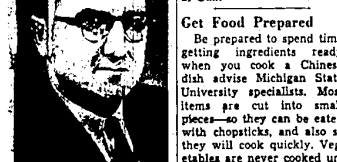

The United Society, a major agency of the Christian Churches (Disciples of Christ) carries on its ministries through the voluntary cooperation of the Christian Churches, the largest Protestant communion to have originated in the United States.

The Rev. McCrae has degrees from the University of Toronto, the University of Chicago and Yale University. He writes extensively in the area of Christian Education.

He will speak at the 10 a.m. service of the church; temporary meeting at Piersen Elementary School, between Merriman and Farmington Roads on Seven Mile.

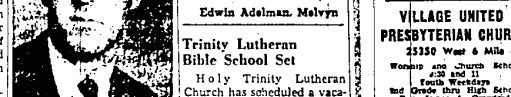
