Esch Asks Voters For Answers

Congressman Marvin L. Esch has announced the mailing of some 130,000 "Your Opinion" questionnaires to residents of Michigan's Second Congressional District.

According to Esch the questionnaire contains 15 queries on national issues with several open to most of the general topic areas.

"This is at least an opportunity for people to make their voices heard in Washington," Esch said. "I always value and welcome the opinions of my constituents and I hope many of them will use this vehicle to contact me."

Issues covered on the questionnaire include the war in Vietnam, the draft law, civil rights, income tax amendments, federal spending and social security benefits.

"Certainly it does not include all of the issues on which I must vote, nor does it spell out the complexities of each problem. What I have attempted to do is to single out some of the most important areas and alternatives," Esch said.

Two columns labeled "his" and "hers" are included so that both husband and wife may answer separately and respondents are invited to attach a separate sheet if they wish to expand their views.

Each said that the mailing is scheduled to be delivered to every home in the Second Congressional District, but that if persons fail to receive it they should write him for a copy c/o the House Office Building, Washington, D.C. Plans also call for distribution at county fairs and other public gatherings.

Big Circus Is Coming For State Fair

The Michigan State Fair has scheduled a big, free, three-ring circus in the Grandstand for six days of the annual Fair which opens Friday, Aug. 23 and continues through Labor Day, Sept. 4.

It is the Barnes-Carruthers Circus which will perform three times daily for six days Monday, Aug. 28 through Saturday, Sept. 2.

Cass J. Wasung, State Fair selling manager, points out that the circus will be free for patrons once they are on the grounds. General admission to the Fair, itself, is \$1.50 with children 12 and under free.

The circus entertainment, arranged by the committee headed by Authority member Carl Mantley of Caro, will feature three rings of animals, clowns and daredevils including saw pole.

Top Bands Perform At Park Dances

Buddy DeFranco and the Glenn Miller Orchestra will highlight the "Dancing Under the Stars" program when they appear at the open-air dance pavilion at Metropolitan Beach at Long Lake St. Clair near Mt. Clemens, on Sunday, July 30.

Tommy Baldwin, a well-known Detroit band, will provide dance music on Saturday, July 29. Both events start at 8:30 p.m. There is no charge for dancing except the usual 50-cent parking fee.

The following dress regulations apply during orchestra dance nights: Women should wear blouses and skirts or dresses and men should wear a shirt and slacks, however, ties are not required. Patrons may not use the dance site while dressed in bermudas or bathing suits and women are not permitted to wear slacks at the dance pavilion.

Rose Chlorosis Can Be Avoided

Roses will develop chlorosis if the iron level of the soil drops below minimum requirements.

Symptoms are yellowing of leaves, poor growth and improper flowering.

To prevent chlorosis, apply from 2 to 4 tablespoons of micronized iron and work it lightly into the soil.

Then water. To correct chlorosis, double the amount of iron. In highly alkaline soil, repeat the application in 7 to 10 days.
