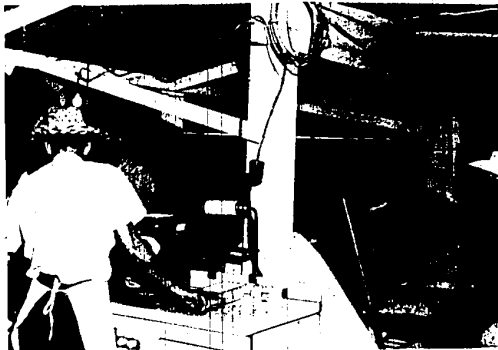

Ladies, Don't Cook During Festival

With all the good food that will be available to eat in town from Thursday, July 27, through Saturday, July 29, any local housewife who cooks a meal at home is wasting her time. The Founders Festival is always noted for its food, and this year will be no exception.

At the Masonic Temple from 5 to 8 p.m. Thursday night, Trinity Shrine 44 will be serving a smorgasbord ham dinner with all the trimmings. Price will be \$3 for adults, \$1 for children under 12. Members are preparing to sell at least 300 dinners.

That night Bethel 55 will be selling refreshments at the concert at the Village Green. On Friday night from 5 to 8 p.m., the Order of the Eastern Star will serve an old-fashioned family style chicken dinner in the temple. Besides homemade biscuits, the dinner will feature homemade pies. Members are baking 50-60 pies for the event and plan on serving 600 dinners. This meal is also priced at \$2 for adults and \$1 for children under 12.

In downtown Farmington Center, the Jaycees will be serving Kentucky Fried Chicken dinners throughout the Festival. Saturday in City Park they will serve barbecue chicken dinners.

THE BARBECUING will be done over a huge pit that measures 70 feet long.

The Jaycees estimate they will sell 1,000-plus dinners. The Elks will begin cooking for their big Ox Roast early in the Festival. They will put the first ox on to cook at 6 p.m. Wednesday night so that it will be ready to serve early Thursday morning.

The Elks have set up a bull-sitting-roster on a 24-hour watch through the entire three days of the festival. The roster will see to it that the meat is done to a turn.

THE OX ROAST sandwiches will sell for 75 cents and will be available at the Elks' concession in the northeast corner
