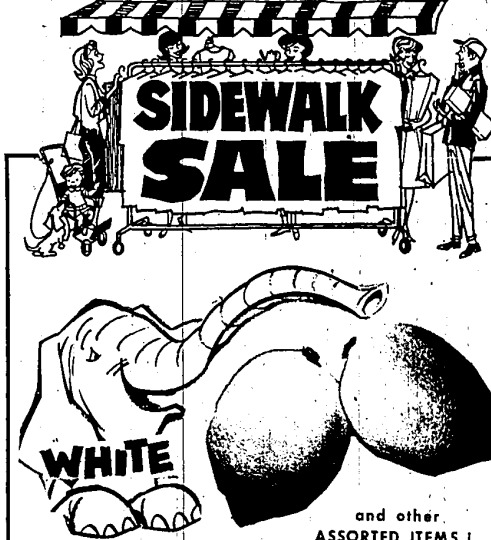

It is well and good that time is taken once again to recognize the valuable heritage which has made the Farmington area an enjoyable place to live, work and prosper.

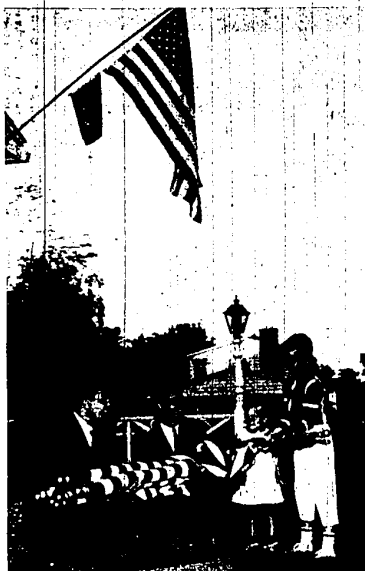

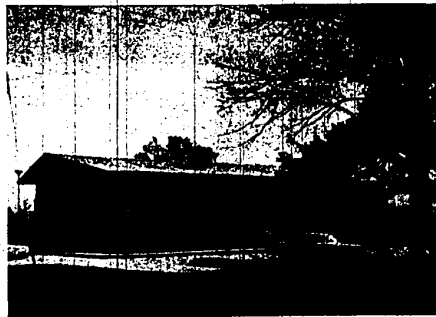
