



MONEY SAVING reform came to the jury system in circuit court when Governor Romney signed into law creating six-man juries instead of 12. Co-sponsored by Redford's representative in Michigan's lower House, John Bennett (Dem.) on the right, and Richard Young of Dearborn Heights, the bill will save Wayne County an estimated \$100,000. Twenty-one per cent of this country's circuit cases are civil, not criminal. The whole thing could save Michigan, \$400,000 at the county level, Bennett feels. "The idea is working fine now in Florida. It simply cost less to pay six rather than 12," he said.
